Re: Arrest of Colby Cameron

The Hampton Police Department has arrested and charged an Epping, New Hampshire man with three Felony level offenses; Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated, Conduct After an Accident, Operating After Suspension. All charged as Felony level offenses related to a vehicle crash Hampton.

On Sunday September 4, 2016 at approximately 6:19pm, officers from the Hampton Police Department responded to the area of Ashworth Avenue and Bragg Avenue for a report of a vehicle collision. Upon arrival, officers located the two vehicles that were involved in the crash. Additionally, officers identified a female victim who had sustained serious bodily injury as a result of the crash. There were no reports of any other injuries in this collision. Police allege that after the crash, the operator of one of the vehicles fled the scene on foot. A short time later, officers found the male driver and identified him as Colby Cameron, 22, of Epping New Hampshire.

Officers allege that further investigation revealed that Cameron's driver's license was suspended. They further allege that Cameron was determined to be under the influence of alcohol. Cameron was subsequently charged with a Felony charge of Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated, a Felony charge of Conduct After an Accident, and a Felony charge of Operating After Suspension as a subsequent offense. It was also discovered that Cameron was out on Probation for an unrelated offense out of Salem, NH.

Cameron was arraigned in the 10th Circuit Court on September 6, 2016. Bail was set at \$15,000 cash and Cameron is scheduled to appear at the 10th Circuit - Seabrook District Court on September 13, 2016 at 1:00pm for a Probable Cause hearing. Probation issues are being handled by the NH Department of Probation and Parole.

The Hampton Police Department is continuing to investigate the incident. Police are encouraging residents to seek safe and sober rides.
